Academic Activities

All MAC experiences are unique, but always include pro-section presentations, scrubs, accommodations, lectures, demonstrations, many meals and activities at our facilities that house the Anatomical Studies Laboratory of North America, located at The Charter Place, in Buffalo, NY.

For all conferences, lab time is used to suggest pathology and cause of death, to compare systems in the variety of cadavers, anatomical presentations and most importantly to master anatomy. American medical professions, education, and health care are also discussed pre- and post-conference exams are used to assess learning. Hard work is rewarded with a certificate of completion.

Dissection Conferences (G1, G2 and G3) also include participants performing cadaver dissections.

Survey Conferences (SA1) utilize hands-on study of many dissected human cadavers while discussing clinical applications. Suture practice will be available.

Deposits secure participation and should be confirmed as accepted by Chartered Professors before airfare is purchased. Tutors in Italy and administrators in Buffalo will assist with travel planning. All participants must obtain health insurance of their choice and travel insurance is strongly suggest to refund any paid conference fees in case you cancel for any reason. Conference fees are determined by the costs to secure cadavers, faculty, staff, supplies and activities for all, therefore fees are non-refundable.

Mazzotti Anatomy Conferences (MACs)

The MACs began in 2010 earning international recognition and praise. Named for the President of the Bologna Medical School and of the European Federation for Experimental Morphology, the late Professor Giovanni Mazzotti that hoped to invite the best students from each of the Italian medical schools to participate and form relationships. Each year, hundreds of students apply and nearly 2500 have participated.

Accommodations and Meals

Accommodations and meals while at TCP are included in the conference fees for only the dates listed. Plan to arrive anytime on the starting date and to leave on the ending date. Early arrivals will need to arrange for other accommodations (we can help). TCP has several bunk beds per room, shower facilities, a dining hall and lounging areas. Participants may choose their bunkmate; however little time will be allotted for sleeping. Those that require different accommodations will be responsible for the extra charges, some meals and possibly daily transportation to and from TCP.

TCP has ping-pong, Karaoke, musical instruments and a large video screen in our own performing arts center, the Tacoma Performing Arts Center (T-PAC), where lectures and some cultural events will be provided. Most meals are included, unless there is an offsite activity or free time, in our restaurant, the Grand Room. TCP is located in a welcoming Italian-American neighborhood, near a large park for running, golf, tennis, a zoo, a movie theater, restaurants, shops, and our Italian Cultural Center.

Travel

Many organize and travel with their classmates. Attendees have utilized the Toronto airport (YYZ) 2 hours from Buffalo, and the Buffalo airport (BUF). One choice is roundtrip air from Italy to New York City then a round trip plane or train ticket from NYC to Buffalo (allowing for days in NYC). Some fly into Toronto and out of BUF to NYC.

Cultural Activities

This is a conference like no other. Be prepared to leave your comfort zone! We welcome those with an open mind --- excited to master anatomy but also to master English, try new food, befriend new people, enjoy unfamiliar music and venues while remaining pleasant with little or no sleep! Be prepared for schedule adjustments due to weather or opportunities.

Together we will spend time at the beaches of the Great Lakes and enjoy concerts, sporting events, parties, cultural events and explore Niagara Falls. 2025 MAC Fees

Conference fees for all experiences include: TCP (hostel) accommodations, most meals and activities, time in Niagara Falls, and transportation to and from the Buffalo Airport (BUF), train or bus station. One the first day of the conference, one evening transport from YYZ to TCP, and on the last day, one morning transport from TCP to YYZ will be provided. Time spent in Toronto or New York City is often organized by the attendees and tutors.

G1, G2 and G3 fees of \$3375 includes complete cadaver dissection.

SA1 \$1675 includes hands-on dissected cadaver comparisons, clinical discussions and suture practice.
